Initiate national investment in appropriate data and tissues collection and storing rules




Biobanking


General Consent

The new Swiss Human Research Act requires previous consent for the use of routine clinical and genetic data and of biological material for research purposes



Biobanking

Switzerland requires a major investment in biobanking, to establish high quality sample handling, appropriate infrastructures and a spirit of data sharing



Identify local requirements and implementation plan

Align with national initiatives (e.g. research infrastructures, biobanking platform etc.
